# Architects




Álvaro Siza was born in Matosinhos, a small coastal town near Porto.

Is a Portuguese architect and architectural educator and he is internationally known for his work.

Awards: Pritzker Prize/ Royal Gold Medal.



# Scientists



Garcia de Orta (or Garcia d'Orta) (1501 – 1568) was a Portuguese Renaissance Sephardi Jewish physician, herbalist and naturalist.

He was a pioneer of tropical medicine, and ethnobotany, working mainly in Goa, a Portuguese colony in India.



# Artists



José Sobral de Almada Negreiros (April 7, 1893 – June 15, 1970) was a Portuguese artist.

Besides literature and painting, Almada developed ballet choreographies, and worked on tapestry, engraving, murals, caricature, mosaic, “azulejo” and stained glass.



# Artists



Paula Rego (born 26 January, 1935), is a Portuguese visual artist who is particularly well known for her paintings and prints based on storybooks.

# Musicians



Amália Rodrigues (Fundão, July 23, 1920 – Lisbon October 6, 1999) was a Portuguese *fadista* (fado singer in direct translation) and actress. Known as the *Rainha do Fado* (*Fado Queen*). Rodrigues helped popularize fado worldwide and travelled internationally between the 1950s and 1970s. She also became the most important figure in the genre.



# Musicians



Sérgio Godinho is a Portuguese poet, composer, and singer. He was born on August 31, 1945 in Porto, Portugal, and is one of the most influential popular musicians in Portugal. He often is considered the greatest name of the Portuguese popular music.





# Sports



Cristiano Ronaldo is a Portuguese professional footballer who plays for Spanish club Real Madrid and the Portuguese National team. He is a forward and serves as captain for Portugal.

By the age of 22, Ronaldo has received Ballon d'Or and FIFA World Player of the Year nominations.
